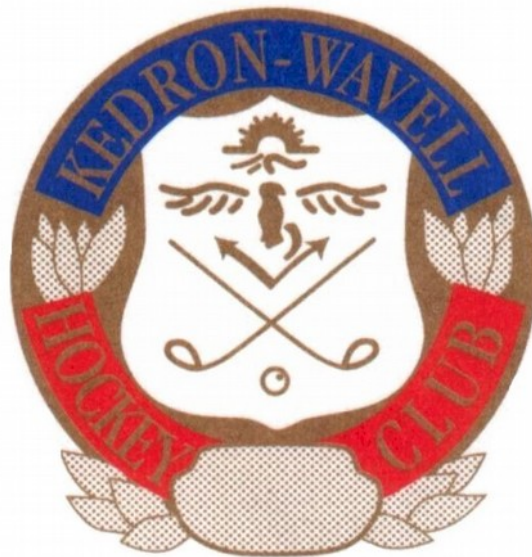

President's Report

Firstly, a review of 2013 has to start with an acknowledgement of the wonderful season that the Division 1 women had this year. Although it was heartbreaking to miss out in that last minute of extra-time, I have no doubt that the experience will steel the team to sweep the cabinet next season. It also struck me that, whilst the team was full of players who gained representative honours across all levels, they are first and foremost a great team ... which you can see in everything they do and the support they give each other ... and, in that respect, the whole "K-Dub" Division 1 team is a shining example of everything that is good about our sport.

The depth of support out at Colmslie on grand final day from across the Club, including Wolfie, many life members and many juniors, reminded me again of the great spirit that exists in our Club. It also reminded me of my acknowledgement last year that, as with almost every sporting organisation, we survive, succeed and prosper on four pillars: our players, our organisational personnel, our sponsors and our supporters – meaning family, friends and club stalwarts. So, once again can I thank everybody – and I mean everybody – within those groups for every little bit you contribute to make hockey at the Wolves as enjoyable as it can possibly be.

Burringbar Park

Kedron Wavell continued to work with BHA and BWHA to ensure a quality facility for our sport is maintained at Burringbar Park and to ensure it remains the 'Home of Kedron Wavell Hockey'.

The improved grass fields were welcomed this year, but unfortunately BHMG was unable to get funding through the normal channels for construction of a new viewing deck to restore the full view of the field that has temporarily been lost.

However, on a high note, Kedron Wavell, through its participation in BHMG, was instrumental in another key step forward when the Coalition, during the Federal election campaign, committed \$300,000 towards the construction of a second artificial turf field at Burringbar. Matt Smith, our Division 1 Men's coach and former Kookaburra, put on a great show for the media with Hon. Julie Bishop on the hockey field after she had announced the grant.

Your club continues to operate the canteen, including the liquor licence, under the profit share arrangement so that the canteen meets its costs, makes a contribution towards the running of Burringbar Park through BHMG and, most importantly, our Club receives a reasonable return for the considerable effort our members put into running the canteen. We are reviewing this role, however, given the very heavy time commitment that it takes up for the size of the return.

Our Principal Club Sponsor

2013 was the second year of our new sponsorship arrangements with the Services Club, and I want to again acknowledge the enormous support that is provided to our Hockey Club by Kedron Wavell Services Club.

However, as was a concern last year, the very difficult trading ties for the Kedron Wavell Services Club meant that they halved their support to all of their traditionally sponsored clubs and community groups. As this occurred after we had set the season fees, there was a very large effect on our overall trading result.

In the interim, please continue to give our namesake sponsor all the support in return that you can; and we will hopefully see a return to previous sponsorship levels this coming season.

Club Management

The Club's Management Committee and Club Captains did another great job this year, and I was really pleased to attend another great end-of-season Junior's function at Enoggera Bowls Club.

That event again highlighted for me the way in which our supporters, volunteers and parents are the platform of future success. As such, I again urge you to help the Club with whatever time and resources you can spare.

I know full well that these are difficult trading times; but if you are in a business that can look at a sponsorship, then we would love to talk to you as well about how we can work together. We have plenty of space for advertising at Burringbar Park, and room on the uniforms!

Treasurer's Report

This Treasurer's report and the audited Financial Statements that are part of this Annual Report are prepared on a cash accounting basis.

STATEMENT OF INCOME AND EXPENDITURE

2013 resulted in a net loss of \$11,448.30 (2012 Loss \$838.64) for Kedron Wavell Services Hockey Club "The Club". It must be noted that this figure includes a payment to Brisbane Hockey Association of \$28,130.85 for 2012 player registration and game fees that were noted as being outstanding at the year-end close of 2012.

Unfortunately for The Club we were advised during the year that our major sponsor Kedron Wavell Services Club would be only able to provide us with 50% of the sponsorship that we had received in prior years which put strain on our cash flow and meant that additional fundraising was required by all sections as the sections funding was halved.

At year end The Club is owed \$16,580.35 in outstanding player registrations relating to seasons 2011 and 2012 and 2013. The debtors are broken down as follows:

These debtors have not been recognised in the 2013 financial statements as income nor as accounts receivable due to our method of accounting being cash.

The canteen sales increased by \$4,428.23 (11% increase) compared with 2012, it is pleasing to see an increase in sales as the management of the canteen was reviewed with process improvements, menu management and greater controls implemented for 2013. Canteen cost of goods sold decreased by \$9,626.96 (30% decrease) which reflective of the controls implemented to reduce the wastage of food. Overall the canteen returned a significantly improved profit for 2013 of \$10,361.56 (2012:\$2,953) we were fortunate during 2013 that no equipment required replacement.

BALANCE SHEET

The Net Asset position of the Club at year end is lower than 2012 (33.2% decrease) however the outstanding payments to be made by The Club in relation to season 2013 are far less than those that were outstanding in 2012. At year end Brisbane Hockey Association are owed approximately \$4,000 for Men's player registrations (2012: \$28,130.85) as well as a coaching payment of \$3,000. Neither payment has been recognised in these accounts as our method of accounting is cash.

The timely payment of player fees again was an issue during 2013, the Section Treasurers worked hard to have fees collected on time with the Boys, Girls and Women's sections all meeting the 30 April fee payment deadline. The Men's section whilst improved in 2013 requires further improvement in season 2014 to ensure that the cash flow is available when payments are due.

Thank you to Section Treasurers and VP's for their efforts during the year to ensure that fees collection, banking and reporting was done on-time your assistance is greatly appreciated.

Men's Report

The results of Matthew's work will continue to be evident next year as consistency and experience come to the fore.

Division 2 had a tough season with no wins, no draws and ended up finishing 10th. Rad had a difficult task with a number of players being stretched by the move up to Division 2 but the team had a great learning experience and hope to really show the results in 2014.

Division 5 continued their tradition of making it to the final series. Unfortunately they were knocked out in the semis. Thanks go to David Henschell for managing the Division 5 team this year.

Both the Masters teams made it to the Grand Final this year - Division 3 finished second but the mighty Division 2 won the premiership. Thanks to Dave Wilson and Brian Williams for managing these teams.

I would like to thank members of the management committee for putting in extra time for the club - it is hard work and makes a big difference.

As well, the Men's Section has continued to operate through the efforts of some very special people. One key person is Brian Williams who assisted in the set up a sub-committee called the Grey Wolves to manage social events and fundraising for the Men's section as well as the management of the teams. And this is despite a major knee operation mid-season. Andre Antony has again been heavily involved in the organisation of all five teams in the section. A big thank you goes to these two men. Thanks also to our club captain, James Neild, who has really stepped up this year. It has been fantastic to see James and the ladies club captain, Alicia Leddy, working so well together.

I ask all members to continue being supportive as the Men's Section now has some consistency and seems to be getting on top of things. We are also hoping to introduce a Division 4 team to encourage participation from our junior boys giving them a positive platform into senior hockey at our club. Despite the difficulties a lot of us were regulars at training each week and put 100% effort into games. We all had the joy of playing and I would like to thank all players for being part of this wonderful game. The pre-season training has already started for 2014 and there was a decent turnout for the fitness test which is a positive for next year.
