Treasurer's Report

This Treasurer's report and the audited Financial Statements that are part of this Annual Report are prepared on a cash accounting basis.

STATEMENT OF INCOME AND EXPENDITURE

2017 resulted in a net profit of \$14,845.23 (2016 profit \$43,334.50) for Kedron Wavell Services Hockey Club the "Club". The 2017 result should be read with the following notes:

BALANCE SHEET

Net assets of the Club have again increased in 2017 to \$114,634.12 up from \$99,778.89 in 2016. As noted above various expenses have been paid within the 2017 Financial Year.

The Club's policy of 30 April deadline for the payment of player fees is crucial for the Club to be able to meet its financial obligations during the season. The Girls and Women's sections are to be commended on their continual adherence to this policy, with majority of fees collected for 2017.

The Club trialled invoicing through MYOB in 2017 for the Junior section of the club allowing members to pay invoices directly online with credit cards allowing for transparency and statements to be sent if/when required. In 2018 we will continue this introduction with the men's section and possibly the women.

Men's Report

For the Men 2017 delivered much more than we expected when we gathered in November 2016 to start planning. To rattle off some achievements that we are proud of:

- The Club fielded 9 Men's teams for the first time in memory! For the first time in many years we competed in all grades of divisional hockey and 3 of the 4 masters divisions.
- Premierships in 2 grades (out of a possible 10): Division 6 and Masters 4
- A grand final appearance for the first time in twenty years in second grade (next year!!)
- Finals appearances for Division 5 and Masters 2.
- A very competitive performance from our Division 1 men including a last second loss to grand finalists, Labrador, and a draw with defending premiers Bulimba
- A young, vibrant first grade squad which will continue to develop in future years
- A host of representative players
- An influx of new young players
- And an incredible Wolves club spirit as evidence by the number of supporters at grand finals, especially the Division 2 grand final.
- the absolute highlight of the year was the weekend when all 6 Divisional teams were successful and we managed 2 wins and a draw in Masters matches.

I'd like to take some time to thank the people associated with the Men's club without who we wouldn't have achieved the successes we have this year.

- The Men's Committee:
 - Our secretary Brian Williams whose efforts at coordinating teams and players continues to amaze me
 - Our Treasurer, Michelle Weekes, who has kept us on the straight and narrow and who is continually frustrated by Brian, Andre and I and our lack of financial ability!
 - Andre Antony, Club legend and newly appointed recruitment manager
- Coaches and Managers for 2017: these people gave freely of their time throughout 2017, were generally at training and matches before players and after players had left for no personal benefit. I'd like to point out two in particular, Paul Nixon and James Treeby. We made the season a nightmare for you guys by adding a team at the last minute and then leaving it to you to sort out, that you did so with aplomb and led one of them to a finals appearance was sensational.
- Umpires: Many players gave of their time to umpire as required and we thank them for taking that share of the burden. I'm aware that at least four guys have umpired for BHA on a regular basis, and I'd like to especially thank them, Craig Dalzell, Matthew Weekes, Darren Stephens, and Hayden Newell. Thanks guys.
- Supporters: This year saw a marked increase in the number of Wolves supporters at matches. I'm sure there were many more but the faces I recognised at just about every game I attended were Scotty, Paul Nixon and the Hamilton's. Thank you to all the supporters out there.
- The inspirational and passionate players: throughout the club there is a large number of guys who I would describe as inspirational and passionate. I've picked a couple: Adam McClelland, returned to the club this season and was an immediate leader on and off the field. Baeden Choppy, whose words in the ears of young players were invaluable and Scott Macaulay who played in three teams regularly and whose passion is obvious to everyone who knows him.
- The Young Guns: we are especially excited to have many up and coming juniors and juniors that have just transitioned to seniors. Of Brisbane clubs, there are only three who can say they are genuinely helping develop the next generation of players. I'm very proud that we are one of these. Tyler, Hayden, Declan, Cooper, Tom, Saul, Dan, Brendan, Lewis and Matt G. (and anyone else I have missed!)

- Our Key Sponsors: Stronach Building, TPS Physio, Jumbo Interactive and Kedron Wavell Services Club. Thank you to these businesses and their contribution to our club. Without you our successes would be impossible.
- The players who backed up regularly to ensure we had full teams in every grade, especially those guys that regularly played on both days of the weekend and the guys who made dashes between venues on a Sunday because Brisbane Hockey couldn't schedule to save themselves.
- Wolf Spirit: the indomitable spirit of the Wolves.

Our Performances:

Let's run through our results in 2017:

- Firsts: Finished seventh (same as 2016) but showed big improvement with much better for and against and good results against top class teams
- Seconds: Finished third in the regular season and then beat memorial cup winners Saints in the first round of finals and Undefeated minor premiers Commercial to be first through to the GF. Unfortunately, Saints played well and we weren't successful
- Thirds: Eighth. A young development team with a couple of old heads to lead.
- Fourths: Sixth: A tough year for a young squad.
- Fiftths: Fourth and beaten in first round of finals. Great result.
- Sixths: Minor Premiers and Grand final victors for our perennial overachievers.
- Masters 2: Third in regular season and eliminated in semis.
- Masters 3: Fifth, missed out on finals by one point.
- Masters 4: Minor Premiers and grand final winners.

Overalls this was an amazing result for our club. Finalists in five of nine grades grand finalists in three grades and premiers in two.

So where are we heading in 2018? In a word: UP. We gained respect in 2017 across the board. 2018 will be the year we start to dominate and build a dynasty. Our first grade squad is young and welcomed some great new talent this year. We earned the respect of the competition and with the introduction of a new coach in 2018 with new directions, 2018 could be anything! Importantly we are now in a position where we no longer have players spread thinly and we are competitive in every grade in which we play. With the ongoing development of our juniors and the Wolves becoming an attractive club to play with 2018 and beyond, looks very promising. There is one key thing which will hold us back: money. Regrettably hockey in Brisbane is becoming a semi-professional sport and the key players who provide the extra 3% necessary to win a premiership all expect a fee for their services. This is in sharp contradiction to the one for all ethos of our club. We need to determine whether we want first grade success and the desirability that comes with that or whether we are happy being close without cigars. To get both will require sponsorship and money.

Ladies' Report

2018 was a good year for some teams and not so good a year for other teams.

Our Division 1 ladies started on a strong note but lost a few valuable players to injury in the first month of the season. They never really recovered from these losses and just missed out on a finals berth in August. It is hoped a few new additions and returning players in 2018 will change the luck around and the results will be far better next year.

Division 2 and 3 both made semis after strong performances all season. Just the luck of the day saw them not proceed to the pointy end but again, next year hopefully holds good results for these teams with many juniors transitioning to the senior ranks.

BWHA relegated last year's Division 4 team into Division 5 this year. We were initially disappointed but the team set out to prove BWHA wrong and fired strongly all season. They made semis, but again, were just pipped at the last minute from going further.

BWHA made a grading decision to move last year's DP2 grand final winners into DP1. Whilst we had thought potentially of fielding a DP1 side, we made a conscious decision to hold for another year to build some younger players. This was not to be the case with BWHA moving us into the top division to try and build numbers in the higher grade. It's a credit to the players in that team that they hung in there week after week. They weren't beaten resoundingly each week but were instead very competitive and if they return in 2018 then the team will no doubt have a strong season.

DP3 emerged minor premiers and went into the grand final but unfortunately couldn't pull off a win on the day. DP5 didn't make finals but with some up and coming juniors and some older, wiser heads, their turn in the sun is bound to come.

To increase the number of MM1 teams this year BWHA reduced the age for MM1 only to 30 (instead of the normal 35). This meant we could field a team in this division for the first time in some years. It's a credit to Leslie Anderson and her band of 'young oldies' that they not only put in a team, but they won the grand final in a nail biting draw followed by penalty shootouts. Great work ladies.

The MM2 team weren't quite so lucky and look forward to 2018.

It's been a great year for umpire development in the ladies this year. Mel Blanchard and Abby Heffernan went away to National 15s and 13s respectively and both received favourable feedback. We had a number of other umpires head to state tournaments. To those of you who step up and umpire every week, we salute you.

I'd like to thank everyone who contributed to the ladies' section this year. Players, coaches, umpires, manager, canteen volunteers and all others who make our club simply the best: we thank you. The Wolf spirit has really emerged this year with more and more supporters coming out to watch our games. BWHA and BHA have given commitments to increase the number of club days in 2018 so get your red and white colours ready – you are needed!
