

## **President's Report**

Despite a few COVID19 interruptions, we all made it to the end of season 2021, albeit a few teams with shortened seasons and/or finals series.

Happily, the Men won the Premiership in all four of those divisions - finishing the season with 4 premierships from their 8 teams, the most of any Brisbane Men's Club. Given they couldn't be recognised at their Presentation Night, I thought it worth special mention in this report.

As it did in 2020, Hockey as a sport responded wonderfully - at every level - to the challenges of COVID. In particular, it was great to see the Wolf Cup in full swing again - it really has become a symbol of our Club's contribution to hockey in the region. The whole team behind the Wolf Cup deserves huge credit for what they set up and continue to achieve.

The Club's Management Committee and Section Committees did another great job this year in the circumstances. and together with all of you who contribute to make our Club activities happen off the field: organising sections, canteen, teams, partnerships and all the other myriad activities that make it possible for the players to run out every week, I thank you. ## **Brisbane Hockey Management Group Report**

Kedron Wavell Hockey is one of three associations which form Brisbane Hockey Management Group (BHMG). The other associations are Brisbane Women's Hockey Association and Brisbane Hockey Association. Each association appoints 3 directors to the Board of BHMG with the 2021 Club appointees being Amanda Paech, Ian Jones and Ian Harcla.

The Group holds the lease for the Brisbane North Hockey Centre, Burringbar Park and is responsible for the management and upkeep of the facility.

With the completion of the second artificial surface (field 2) and the renovation of the grass field the facility now has its full complement of fields to service the Brisbane hockey community and other ancillary sports.

While 2021 was affected by COVID the facility was close to fully utilised during the winter season demonstrating the high level of demand for quality hockey facilities on the northside of Brisbane. The Board of BHMG is now focused on how to maintain the facility at the lowest possible cost to its users. While our Club is a prominent user of the facility and a key contributor to the Board, its interests and those of other users must be managed by the Board to ensure the facility remains financially sound.

Key objectives for the Board in the year ahead are:

- Replacement of the turf and underlying shock pad on field 1 which has now had 11 seasons on it and is
  showing serious signs of wear. While BHMG has a substantial balance in its sinking fund it still requires
  significant funding from governments (\$250 to \$300k) to meet the final cost. Applications/submissions to all 3
  levels of government are being used to finance the project but the Board is mindful of the substantial costs
  incurred by governments in fighting the impacts of COVID and subsequent budgetary limits. It is not expected
  that the replacement of the turf will be completed until late 2022 at the earliest.
- Improvement in spectator facilities including canteen expansion and viewing infrastructure. With the higher
  level of use of the facility the canteen needs expansion to accommodate increased demand. The initial focus
  will be on short term enhancements of the existing canteen facility while plans are drawn up and funding
  sought for a larger project to construct new facilities to accommodate the canteen and spectator viewing.

As such, I want to give a special thanks to our Junior secretary, Lisa Newbold, and Ladies VP Tash Gaddes, who have provided endless support hours to myself and the section. I'd also like to thank our umpire coordinator and mentor, Alyson Aleksic. Alyson volunteered to manage all our junior umpire allocations; she also took time out each week (and weekend) to mentor a group of up and coming young umpires through the season.

For those unaware, club stalwart Jenny Tidey OAM has decided to step down from her patron role. Thank you to Jenny for all your support provided to our section over the years, particularly during your Patron role. You have been a rock and mentor to many previous Junior VPs and me, sharing your knowledge of hockey management and club history.

Lastly, I must thank our junior coaches, managers, selectors, and senior players who have given their time for junior development. I appreciate your dedication to the sport and our club.

As for 2021, what a fantastic season we were able to have despite the challenges of Covid 19 for a second year.

We started the 2021 season with a successful Wolf Cup, which moved to a two-day event, increasing the teams to 16 and creating a Plate allowing the lesser experienced teams to compete in a playoff. This year's tournament also saw our Kedron-Wavell girls enter two teams - Kedron White and Kedron Red.

Grass training started a little rocky with frequent cancellations due to the weather but settled downs allowing our teams to come together.

We welcomed some new players to the club, said goodbye to a few, and were excited with several new coaching announcements.

We resumed the post-COVID season with four Turf teams – JT1, JT2 & JT3, our young 13T team, and nine grass teams – JG1, JG2, 13A, 13B, 11A, 11C, U9 Red, U9 Blue and U7.

All teams trained and played in great spirit and camaraderie, and feedback on the season regularly brought comments about how great it was to be back playing and watching hockey

Starting with our season highlights, our JT1 team was dominant across the season, finishing as minor premiers under the coaching of Lisa Jones and Nikki Taylor and then winning the grand final against Commercial. It was the fourth grand final birth in a row and 3rd premiership in four years

Our JG1, JG2, and 13A grass teams also dominated the year undefeated, finished as minor premiers, and when it counted, all three came home as premiers for the 2021 season. An outstanding result!

Thank you to those parents and players who completed their volunteering in the club canteen as part of their registration. A percentage of the canteen proceeds are used for keeping our junior fees low, development clinics and functions such as the junior presentation.

On the representative front, we again had high numbers representing Brisbane teams across the age groups demonstrating Kedron-Wavell's strength. Those that got to go away for their championships all had fun and competed well. Furthermore, congratulations to all the girls selected in a state squad and team. We look forward to seeing your progress in your hockey at this level.

We want to acknowledge all the older girls who, by age, have played their last game of junior girl's hockey proudly for Kedron Wavell. #### **Team Awards**

Many of the traditional accolades are designed to recognise individual players. In 2019, the Club introduced team awards.

Hockey is all about teamwork, our club is all about teamwork and to quote Rudyard Kipling: For the strength of the pack is the wolf, and the strength of the wolf is the pack.

With this firmly in mind, the Club developed team trophies for the Senior and Junior divisions (that is, all Senior teams – Division, Masters and Downey Park – are compared for one set of team trophies; and all Junior teams are compared for the Junior trophies):

- Best Attacking Senior/Junior Team determined by the highest average number of goals scored per game.
- Best Defensive Senior/Junior Team determined by the lowest average goals conceded per game; and
- **Best All-round Senior/Junior Team** determined through the highest average goal difference per game.

Average goals, rather than total goals, are used given the different number of rounds across the various competitions.

#### **Junior Team Awards**

In 2019, our JT1 girls took out the best attacking team with more than 2.5 goals per game on average and defended just as well conceding only 0.5 goal on average. JT1 took out the all-round trophy with these statistics. The best defensive team, however, went to JG1 with a conceded goal average of only 0.43 – tremendous stats for our young players defending amazingly.

2021 sees a very different result. This year ONE team has taken out all the Team Awards and that is the U13A Blue Team, coached by Rhiannon Aleksic.

**Best Attacking Junior Team** - with goals scored on average of 6.12 per game, this team spent a lot of time in their attacking circle. With their youngest player and striker Sabrina scoring 22, the Gledhill twin duo scoring 16 each, and the forward line of Izzy, Sienna and Lucy scoring 43 between them, this team of champions scored 104 goals in their fixture season and backed the season up with a grand final victory.

**Best Defensive Junior Team** - now whilst these girls are scoring demons, they were also just as strong in defense. This team was not letting the opposition get over the halfway line much to get a chance at scoring against them, with statistics of only 0.20 per game. This equated to only 4 goals for the season. Easts got 2 against them, our 13A Red team snagged 1 against them, and Ascot got 1.

**Best All-round Junior Team - i**t is not hard to understand how this team now wins the Best All Round Team. In 17 games of fixtures, 13A Blue were undefeated with 15 wins and 2 draws. Totaling 104 goals for, and only 4 against, this team has done a massive job to have a goal difference of 100 goals! Not something we see often in hockey.

#### **Senior Team Awards**

**Best Attacking Senior Team** - this year was a men versus women's top two, with two teams getting to four goals per game average. By the end of the regular season, the Women's PL1 team had averaged exactly four goals per game in attack, but they were pipped this year by a senior men's team averaging nearly 4.3 goals per game in the opposition's net. Congratulations to the perennial over-achievers, the Men's Division 6 team, on winning the Best Attacking Senior Team for 2021

**Best Defensive Senior Team** - this year was a contest between several of the women's teams, with six teams getting under the magic 1.0 goal conceded per game average. By the end of the regular season, two of our teams had conceded only 0.5 goals per game in attack, so a special mention to our Division 4 and Division 5 teams on that great result. However, they were both topped out by a genuinely impressive record of only 0.37 goals per game conceded (just 7 for the season) achieved by the first Premiership Winners this year and now the winners of the Best Defensive Team trophy – the Women's Masters 1 team.

**Best Senior All-round Team -** this trophy wasn't decided until after 9pm on the final Tuesday night game. Up until then, the Men's Division 4 Masters team had the lead in the competition. However, with a number of injuries in the side, they were unable to hold their impressive form through the last two rounds and finished third in the field with an average goal difference of 2.72 goals per game as we already had two teams back in the clubhouse with exactly the same average goal difference of 2.89 goals per game. So, our joint winners for 2021 of the Best All-round Senior Team, are the Women's PL1, and the Men's Division 6.
